

So, how do I get started?

Step 1: Visit the Campus

Simply make an appointment with a Rasmussen College Admissions Representative. We'll discuss your goals, interests, and educational needs. You're encouraged to bring your parents, friends, and other family members to this meeting. We'll work with you to find just the right program & mix of courses, whether you plan to attend during the day, evening or on-line ... or a combination of all three!

Step 2: Submit Your Application



To become a student at Rasmussen College you'll need to complete an application form. These can be found in our catalog, or you can call 888-549-6755 to request one. Our application fee is \$60 and this fee must accompany your completed application.

It's best to apply for admission as far in advance of the starting date as possible. Some programs have limited enrollment and fill quickly. Also, certain scholarship and grant programs have early enrollment deadlines.

Step 3: Complete Your Placement Exam

Rasmussen College applicants complete a skill level placement test called the STEP Test. This exam measures English, reading, and math abilities so we can place you in the best classes for your needs. This test is not timed, although many students complete it in 2 hours or less. Your Admissions Representative will work with you to schedule a testing time that works for you.

Step 4: Supply Us With Your Transcripts

A student applying for admission to Rasmussen College must provide their certified high school transcript or GED results along with transcripts from any other colleges attended. The staff at Rasmussen College will assist you with this process.



Step 5: Attend Orientation

A week or two prior to the beginning of the quarter, New Student Orientation is conducted. Attendance at orientation is required of all students. General college policies and procedures, and student services are discussed at orientation. Orientation Day is also a great opportunity to find out about scheduling, purchase textbooks, and meet fellow students.
