RASMUSSEN COLLEGE ANNOUNCES SECOND ROUND OF 110-YEAR ANNIVERSARY SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

Shakopee Resident Kristina Kupietz Receives \$5,000 Academic Scholarship to Apply Toward Associate's in Surgical Technician Degree Program at Brooklyn Park Campus

BROOKLYN PARK, Minn., (August 26, 2010) – Local resident Kristina Kupietz has been named a recipient of the Rasmussen College 110-Year Anniversary Scholarship. An initial group of 25 scholarship recipients was announced on May 2010. Kupietz is one of 34 scholarship recipients named in a second announcement. The \$5,000 scholarship will benefit her completion of an Associate's in Surgical Technician degree program through Rasmussen College in Brooklyn Park. The Scholarship Selection Committee chose Kupietz from nearly 1,300 applicants across the country.
